



Please ensure your child comes to school wearing the school uniform (no hoodies etc.)



Year 6 Duxford Trip

On Tuesday our Year 6s visited Duxford Imperial War Museum to enrich their learning about World War One and World War Two. All of the children were awe-struck by the exhibits which showcased an array of military vehicles and technology used by British, American and German armed forces throughout both wars. The trip enabled the children to learn lots of new information and fascinating facts about how tanks, airplanes and other vehicles were used to support the war effort on both fronts. Highlights included: seeing the WW2 Spitfire and Hurricane planes, B52 American Bomber and reenactment of the Battle of Britain operation centre at Duxford.



Year 6 Science Workshop

Year 6 had a visit from some female scientists currently working at Cambridge University. They ran a Physics workshop with the children where they were challenged to try and power calculators and buzzers using only coins, cardboard and foil as the cell. The children also used voltage metres to measure the power of their cell. This all consolidated the learning they have been doing on Electricity this half term.


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

Are there any side effects of the vaccine?

ble side effects are: decreased appetite, headache, a runny or uncode noise, and sometimes a raised temperature. These are common, but they pass quickly and can be treated with paracetamol or ibuprofen if you feel your child needs it. blocked nose, and sor nes a raised te rature. These are co

Are there any children who shouldn't have the nasal vaccine?

- You should let us know if your child has any of the following A very severe allergy to eggs, egg proteins, gentamicin o gelatine – it is important for us to know if your child has bee admitted to hospital with a condition called anaphylaxie riggered by these things.
- Are currently wheezy or have been wheezy in the past 72 ho with asthma. There is an alternative flu vaccine that we can talk to you about to ensure that your child is protected as so
- Have a condition that severely weakens their immune system.

Also, children who have been vaccinated should avoid close cont with people with very severely weakened immune systems for around while people while they servery weakened immune systems to a double two weeks following vaccination (By servery) weakened, we generally mean people who are isolating, such as those who have received some types of chemotherapy or people who have had a bone marrow transplant, for example). The nasal flu vaccine is the best v children and young people under 18 years of age as it is more effective at stopping the spread of flu and it is painless, but it does have a highly of flu and it is painless, but it does have a highly processed form of gelatine (porcine gelatine), which is used in a range of many essential medicines. The gelatine helps to keep the vaccine virues stable so that the vaccine provides the best protection against flu.

If your faith or beliefs mean you would prefer a vaccine that has no pork (porcine gelatine) in it, please complete the consent for the flu injection only. You do not need to complete a form for both.
