Year 3 Flag Fen Trip

Year 3 had a great day at Flag Fen on Wednesday! It was lovely to experience history first hand by handling artefacts and sitting in a real Bronze Age roundhouse! We also got to make our own clay pots using similar tools and techniques as our Bronze Age ancestors.



National Literacy Trust visit - Year 5 and 6

Some of our Year 5 and Year 6 children had the wonderful opportunity to meet Jess French - who is an author, TV and Radio Presenter, Vet and wildlife expert - to hear about her new book: Beastlands.

More than 750 children from seven different schools across the city got to hear Jess French talk about her new book, Beastlands: Race to Frostfall Mountain, as part of a visit organised by the National Literacy Trust in Peterborough on Thursday 25 January 2024.



Year 5 and 6 pupils were invited to two different talks from the author and television personality, the first at St John's Church School in the morning and the second at Gladstone Park Community Centre in the afternoon.

Children heard an extract from the book, asked questions about Jess's favourite adventures, life as an author and where inspiration comes from, and each school took copies of Beastlands: Race to Frostfall Mountain for their school library spaces.

The 750 pupils came from seven schools in Peterborough: St John's Church School, Winyates Primary, Braybrook Primary, Leighton Primary, Gladstone Academy, The Beeches Primary and Fulbridge Academy.

The children had a fantastic morning and were perfectly behaved while asking some very thoughtful questions of Jess.

Orton Gospel Hall

KS1 and KS2 had members from Orton Gospel Hall come to deliver an R.E assembly. The main topic focused on the Last Supper, discussing Jesus sharing his final meal with his disciples before his crucifixion.



Year 6 Smoking and Vaping Workshop

On Thursday, Year 6 had members from Healthy Schools visit, to deliver a smoking and vaping workshop. They discussed the various reasons why people smoke/vape and the effects it has on the body. Upon discussing the build up of tar in the lungs of a smoker, a tar jar was presented to the children, so they could physically see what sits inside a smoker's lungs. The children engaged with the discussions really well and offered ways they thought could help people to stop smoking/vaping and also ways to avoid peer pressure into starting.

A free online safety guide looking at the video chat service Monkey, highlighting several risks and suggesting ways to minimise them.

With Omegle finally shutting down in late 2023, the top spot among video chat services is up for grabs – and Monkey has its eyes set on the crown. Randomly matching its users for 15-second conversations, the platform's developers claim to have created a dynamic online space for people to make new connections and, potentially, even some new friends.

Despite these innocuous-sounding intentions, however, Monkey has been criticised for moderation which may not be comprehensive enough to defend against the obvious dangers that unregulated, random video calls pose to the younger element of the site's userbase. Our
